Call for Research Abstracts for Poster Presentation

The Scientific Committee of QIIN Quality 4.5 Summit invites authors to submit their research abstracts for poster presentation.

General Information

- 1. Abstract will be selected based on relevance to quality improvement initiatives/activities undertaken in the organization of any industry sector.
- 2. Abstracts accepted will be displayed as poster slides presentations during the dedicated session of the summit. See programme schedule.
- 3. Abstract will only be reviewed for possible acceptance and display if the author is a registered participant of the summit or any person with QIIN membership.
- 4. Each author is limited to a **maximum** of two abstracts submissions.
- 5. All accepted and displayed abstract will be published in the maiden edition of the Journal of Organizational Quality Improvement (JOQI).

Dates

- Abstract submission opens: July 30, 2023
- Abstract submission closes: September 30, 2023
- Abstract final acceptance notice: October 15, 2023

Submission

- 1. Abstract submission is FREE.
- 2. Abstract should be submitted to Email: jogi@giin.org
- Abstract MUST be submitted in two formats: MS Word and PowerPoint. It is advisable
 to prepare the MS Word format first before the PPT. Download sample templates for
 both formats for your use here.



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Abstract Guidelines

- 1. Type stetting and word count: Arial, font size 12; single spacing; maximum of 500 words excluding titles, author names and affiliations and references.
- 2. Title: Not more than 12 words, Bold Title Case. No mention of name of organization
- 3. Author(s): 15 maximum, ¹Surname, Other Names; ²Surname, Other Names; ...
- 4. Affiliation(s): Use superscript number to identify each affiliation under author
- 5. Corresponding Author: Use asterisk* to indicate contact email and phone number.
- **6. Problem Statement:** Introduce the problem or challenge that your quality improvement initiative or research project addresses. Clearly articulate the problem within the context of organizational quality improvement. Explain why it is important to the problem.
- **7. Objectives:** State the specific objectives or goals of your research project. Describe what you aimed to achieve through your work and the desired outcomes or improvements you sought.
- **8. Methodology:** Describe the methodology or approach you employed. Explain the tools, techniques, or frameworks used to drive the improvement process. Provide a brief overview of the data collection and analysis methods utilized.
- **9. Results or Findings:** Summarize the key results or findings of your quality improvement initiative or research project. Highlight any significant improvements, outcomes, or impacts achieved. If applicable, include relevant quantitative or qualitative data to support your findings.
- 10. Innovation, Implications and Practical Applications: Highlight the innovative aspects of your quality improvement initiative or research project, as well as its practical implementation. Mention any unique approaches, strategies, or solutions implemented and the broader implications and potential applications of your findings or outcomes in the field of organizational quality improvement and its practical implications for diverse industry sectors.
- **11. Conclusion:** Summarize by drawing deduction(s) that links the objective of research to findings and implications. Briefly mention any recommendations or future directions stemming from your work.
- **12. Keywords:** Maximum of five keywords related to the research.
- 13. References: Not more that 3 references in Vancouver Style should be provided.

NOTE: Submissions that DO NOT adhere to the above guideline will NOT be reviewed.
